Daniel H. Wilt, Died suddenly on November 13, 2021 at his home in Moorestown at the age of 50.

He was the husband of Susan E. (nee Smith), and father of Ethan S. Wilt, Henry W. Wilt , and Sophie L. Wilt. Daniel is also survived by his parents Douglas and Donna Wilt, sister Susanne (Nick) LaCava, and niece Gianna LaCava.

Daniel married Susan in May of 1998 at Old Pine Street Church in Philadelphia. They lived in Moorestown until 2003 and again since 2016 after moving from Ellicott City, Maryland. There, Daniel was active with the First Presbyterian Church of Howard County in Columbia, serving as an elder before moving his membership to the First Presbyterian Church of Moorestown, where he and his family had been members previously from 2001 to 2003.

After earning a BS in Business from Drexel University and eventually a Masters in Business Administration from Temple University, Daniel worked in the information technology field for various companies including Visalign (formerly Forté Systems) where he and Susan met and worked together for several years after they were married, Erickson Retirement Communities in Maryland, and most recently COMHAR, Inc. in Philadelphia where he was the Chief Information Officer.

At Drexel, Daniel pledged Tau Epsilon Phi, eventually serving as chancellor of the fraternity. His membership in the Epsilon Eta chapter was an important part of his life. In Moorestown, he served on the Telecommunications and Technology Committee since 2018.

An avid golfer, he also enjoyed gardening, carefully tending to his tomato plants each year. As a “dance dad,” he danced alongside Sophie at both Arabesque Dance School in Columbia, MD, and Ballet NJ in Berlin, NJ, in yearly performances of “The Nutcracker.” He enjoyed skiing and was glad to have Henry as a ski partner. And, as a superfan of the Liverpool Football Club (YNWA), Daniel enjoyed watching matches with Ethan.

A memorial service will be held 10 am on Saturday, November 20, 2021, at the First Presbyterian Church of Moorestown, 101 Bridgeboro Rd., Moorestown, NJ. Interment will be private.
