Elizabeth Rose (Bo) Bunker Howland on January 30, 2021, died peacefully of natural causes, age 95 of Moorestown, NJ. Elizabeth had worked as a stewardess for American Airlines in New York, NY, 1950-1952, where she met her husband William Anthony Hoppin Howland (1913-2005), a pilot with American Airlines. She also had volunteered as a member of the Huntington Hospital Women's Auxiliary, Huntington, NY, for many years while raising six children. She grew up in Cincinnati, OH, daughter of author John L. Bunker and Dorothy Schmidt Bunker. She graduated Ursuline Academy in 1943, attended Xavier University, Cincinnati, and volunteered for the USO during WWII. She wrote and recited poetry, loved movies and was an avid fan of Frank Sinatra and Lucille Ball. She easily made friends with people from all walks of life and was a devoted Catholic and Christian.
