Hilda O. (Weiler) Pschunder of Moorestown passed away on Monday, March Fourth 2013, at home. She was 90.

Born in Vienna, Austria, she survived the bombings of WWII, earned a PhD in economics from the University of Vienna and was fluent in several languages. She emigrated with her family to Watertown, NY, in 1954, and then moved to Moorestown in 1959. Hilda was a devoted wife, mother and grandmother, and a member of the Alter Guild of Trinity Episcopal church in Moorestown for over 35 years and of the Austrian-American Federation.

She is survived by her husband Dr. Ralph Pschunder to whom she was married for 69 years, her three sons, Harald (Barbara), Herbert, Wilfred (Tess), her daughter Heidi (Glenn) Eckenhoff, her grandchildren Amanda, Samantha, Rachel, Alison, Emily, Nicholas, Brian, Kevin, Justin, Lauren and Colin, her brother Georg (Eva) Weiler, MD, nephews Udo, Volkmar and Burkhard, and her cousin Dr. Suzanna (Osfried) Olaj.
