John (Jack) R. Hendrickson of Moorestown, NJ passed away peacefully on May 1, 2020 surrounded by his family at the age of 78. He was born on December 4, 1941 and raised in Newark, NJ by his mother Hazel (Tomlin) Hendrickson. He was a member of the Marine Corps Association, Knights of Columbus and the American Slovak Citizens Club of Roebing, NJ and of the was a member of the NJ Former Trooper Association and the State Troopers NCO Association of NJ.


