Lynn Ware passed on Sept. 5, 2021 at the age of 88 at Medford Leas. She had lived in Moorestown for 40 years with her husband, Ridgeley Ware, who died in 2007, and moved to Medford Leas in 2009. Three sons and families survive: Philip (Stephanie); Christopher (Diane), and Randall (Rebecca). Also survived by her brother Philip Burkett (Mary).and 6 Grandchildren.

For 25 years the Wares owned a commercial real estate finance, sales and consulting business in Moorestown, affiliated with an international real estate finance firm. Earlier, Ridge was president and she vice-president for the advisor to a REIT in Cherry Hill.

Mrs. Ware was an active volunteer for 35 years, including Commissioner, NJ Election Law Enforcement Commission; NJ State Republican Committeewoman; Chair, Moorestown Zoning Board; member, Moorestown Planning Board

She was Assistant District Governor for Rotary District 7500; treasurer and director of Rotary Club of Moorestown. She also chaired the Moorestown Community Calendar Committee for 13 years.

2001 Co-Citizen of the Year, chosen by the Inter-Service Clubs Council from nominees by Moorestown residents. Her favorite charitable activity was donating graphic art designs to non-profits and community groups.
