Constance T. Hughes, age 92, went peacefully to her Lord on December 31, 2020. Our beautiful mom was giving, kind, had a tremendous sense of humor and a strong faith. She will be missed by all who loved and knew her.

Connie was born in Edgewater, N.J. to Daniel G. Dilger and Mary (Casey) Dilger. She married the late Charles J. Hughes, the love of her life, January 22, 1950. They were married for 58 years. Connie and Charlie raised 11 children: Chuck (Helen Muskett), the late Chris (Shobha Pasqualone), Neal (Betsy Looney), Mary (Brent Barbehenn), Jackie (Rob Bent), Dan (Beth Begos), Patti (Rob Cooper), Barbara (Dan Murnane), Stephanie (Mark Ford), Peter (Anne Marie Fitzsimmons) and Geraldine (Dave Link). She had 28 grandchildren and 19 great grandchildren. She is survived by her sister Ethel Scamporino. She was predeceased by her brother Daniel G. Dilger, Jr., her sisters June M. She and Charlie moved to Moorestown in the early 1950's. Connie was an active member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church and taught CCD for years.
