Legendary Businesswoman

(nee Stubergh) Doris M. Damm, of Moorestown, who rose to prominence as a staffing industry pioneer, died on Monday, February 27, 2017. She was 82.

Doris was born in Jamaica Queens, NY. She was a graduate of Fairley Dickinson College with a B.A. in English.

Widely considered one of the nation's preeminent experts in the temporary staffing industry, Doris Damm's rise to prominence began in 1978 with a tiny office in Cherry Hill, New Jersey. Under her leadership, Accu Staffing Services grew to become one of the fastest-growing and most highly respected staffing firms in the country. Today, under the leadership of Doris' husband Edward, their three children and one grandchild, the company employs more than 30,000 people annually throughout its twelve offices in New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

Throughout her career, Doris has been honored with countless awards for her role as an innovator, lecturer, and successful businesswoman. She has served the regional business community as Chairman—Board of Directors, Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia; Board Member—Our Lady of Lourdes

Medical Center & Our Lady of Lourdes Foundation; Member—Advisory Board and Foundation Board, Rutgers University School of Business, Camden; Panelist—Rutgers quarterly economic Outlook panel; Member—Women’s Business Enterprise National Council. Member—Board of Directors, Cherry Hill Chamber of Commerce
