ELLIS LEROY DERRY, a resident of Cadbury of Cherry Hill, previously a long time

resident of Moorestown and Mt. Laurel, died Thursday Nov. 15, 2012 at the age of 95.

He was a graduate of North Plainfield (N.J.) High School and Gettysburg College. During

World War II, he served in the Pacific Theater, and remained in the Active Reserve at the end

of the war, retiring after 22 years with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. After leaving active duty

in the Army, he worked as Export Manager for SKF Industries in Valley Forge, PA, for 30 years

until his retirement in 1982. Predeceased by his college sweetheart, Anita Conner Derry, after
