James Roberts Laessle, a proud lifelong resident of Moorestown, passed away peacefully at his home at the age of 94, on Thursday, December 18th, 2014.

Jim was born on November 1, 1920, and graduated from Moorestown Friends School in 1938, and Lafayette College in 1943. He was a Navy Veteran, who served during WWII as a SeaBee at Iwo Jima.

Jim was President of Laessle Builders Inc. and an active member of the community. He was a member of the Moorestown Rotary Club for over fifty years and served on the Township Council, the Board of Cooper Hospital, MEND, an Acolyte of Trinity Episcopal Church and Troop Leader for the Boy Scouts of America.

His life passion was trains and he was involved in numerous railroading organizations, including as Vice President of the High Iron Company, which ran steam excursions, most notably from Manhattan to Salt Lake City, Utah for the Centennial of the Driving of the Golden Spike in 1969. Jim enjoyed waking every morning to the sight of his PA Reading Shorelines Caboose, which he purchased and restored in 1975.

Jim loved to travel and was an avid sailor. He will be remembered for his

curiosity, wit and off-key sense of humor. He is survived by his wife Nancy, sister Jane, and children Linda, Joan, Bob, Tom, Sarah and John. He will be missed by his dog Abby. Services will be held at 10:00 AM, Tuesday, December 23rd at Trinity Episcopal Church, 207 West Main St., Moorestown, NJ.
