Jack proudly served in the United States Navy for 9 years on the USS Roosevelt and the USS Salisbury Sound and was awarded medals: FOP Service-China Service, FOP Service-Europe Occupation, West Berlin and the US Navy Good Conduct Medal. During his retirement years, he developed a thriving handyman business, he could fix just about anything from cars and plumbing to electrical and construction.
