



Col Leonard B Frank Ret.

Leonard B. Frank, a former Kingston businessman and retired colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve, died peacefully Dec. 31 at The Evergreens in Moorestown, N.J., with his two daughters at his side.

Mr. Frank was the devoted husband of the late Zeena (Singer) Frank and father of daughters Ann Lindenmuth and husband, Gary, of Mount Laurel, N.J., and Ellen Frank and partner Angelo Lopez of New York City. He was also survived by granddaughter Rachel Zucker and husband, Adam, and great-grandchildren Max and Sophie, all of Summit, N.J. Also, sister Sally Ann Rosenn and husband, Harold, and nephew, Scott Rosenn, of Kingston.

He was a successful owner of Leonard Frank Clothes for men in Kingston and was particularly proud of his 37 years of military service. After graduating from the Pennsylvania State University, he worked at Gimbels Department Store in New York City while continuing his education at Columbia University. When World War II broke out in Europe, he enlisted in the Army. He was commissioned a 2nd lieutenant in 1942 and was discharged from the regular Army in 1946. He then served in the Army Reserve for another 31 years, retiring as a colonel in 1977.

For many years, he counseled veterans and their families about military benefits and later wrote a regular newspaper column on the subject. Leonard and Zeena worked side by side at their store on Wyoming Avenue

providing quality traditional men's attire. Like thousands of others, they watched in horror as the Susquehanna River flooded the valley in 1972, destroying their home and nearly claiming their business as well. But they rebuilt and reopened quickly.

They later retired and moved to The Evergreens, a continuing care community, where Mr. Frank was affectionately known as "The Colonel," cruising around in his wheelchair and greeting residents with a snappy salute.

A reception will be held in his honor from 2 to 4 p.m. Sunday at the Evergreens, 309 Bridgeboro Road. Burial will be at Arlington National Cemetery at a yet-to-be determined date
