An animal lover at heart, Janice shared a special bond with her beloved Havanese dog, Petey, who remained by her side throughout her illness. Her faith was an integral part of her life; she prayed daily and held a deep devotion to the Blessed Mother Mary and St. Anthony.

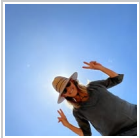
