He began his college career at Rutgers in Newark, transferred to Fairleigh Dickinson after he married, then to Black Hawk State College when he was transferred to Moline Illinois by his company. He finally got his degree from Rutgers University Camden, once he and his family moved to Mt. Laurel. He served with the NJ National Guard, protecting citizens during the Newark riots in the mid 60s. While serving in the National Guard he went to OTS where he was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant. He then served in the Army Reserves until his discharge. Raymond has been a resident of Mt. Laurel for 48 years, where with his wife they ran General Integrated Systems. Ray was a Mason, and a member of Secaucus-Hudson Lodge #72 in Secaucus, NJ. He is a Longtime member of St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Moorestown where he served in many capacities over the years – ushering, reading and acting in St. Matthew Players to name a few.
