



Roberta Ann Wilson

April 13, 1935 - May 30, 2024

Roberta A. Wilson of Moorestown, NJ, passed away on May 30. She was 89 years old. She is survived by her two children Cliff Wilson Jr. (Louise Currey Wilson) of Princeton, and Judy Wilson Enuco (Paul Enuco) of Berlin, NJ, along with grandchildren Hannah Wilson and Brad Goren-Wilson (Maeli Goren-Wilson), and sister Ruth Ternyila.

Her husband of 69 years, Cliff Wilson Sr., passed away last year. Their younger son, Christopher, died in 1981. She was also predeceased by her parents, Regina and John McKnight, and her younger sister Kathleen Bergen.

Born in Pittsburgh, Bobbie and her family moved to New Brunswick when she was a young girl. She graduated from St. Peter's High School there in 1952. She married Cliff in 1954 and they eventually settled in North Brunswick. Bobbie worked part-time for many years, even as she managed the challenges of raising a family that included a child with severe disabilities. She worked as a nurses' aide at St. Peter's Hospital, and later in the offices of various medical practices. In 2004 Bobbie and Cliff moved to Whiting, NJ, to enjoy their retirement.

Bobbie loved everyone and they loved her in return. She was the first to help anyone in need. She was a devoted mother and an incredible grandmother. Bobbie was always the life of the party. She relished daylong neighborhood barbecues for a summer holiday, and when there was no holiday she would make up an occasion, a memorable example being the elaborate wedding of her virtual son Guy (a life-sized, hand-sewn doll) and his bride, Missy (ditto). Bobbie would go to great lengths to pull off a practical joke, and her attic was the go-to spot for family members seeking a great Halloween costume. She enjoyed true crime books and television shows, and also liked knitting, car trips and garage sales.
