We were all his students at one point or another. Friends of his family were considered family. It didn't matter what walk of life you were from; he would be there when you needed him to be. He was the prime example of Mi Casa-Sú Casa. He would always say he was a tough s.o.b. (son of a butcher), but his heart was twice as big. He will be dearly missed by many.

Steve grew up in Trenton, NJ and graduated from Trenton High School in 1957. He went to Trenton State College (now College of New Jersey) where he met his lifelong friend and wife Mary Hilditch. He graduated with a BA and MA in Music Education by 1966. Mary and Steve married June 23rd, 1962. They had 4 children. During these years he had his own business, Camelot Music studio in Toms River, and taught music at Toms River Public Schools followed by Mount Laurel Township Schools. During this time, he tutored students in music.

In his spare time, he had vegetable gardens, was a scout leader for Troop 37 of Trenton and Troop 44 of Moorestown, choir member and youth group leader for Trinity Episcopal Church of Moorestown and was a lifetime member of the German American Society of Trenton. Stephen held many of the

positions on the board at the GAS. He was also the steward for a few years, coached soccer, Thursday night chef, bartender, and always had time to volunteer no matter what had to be done. In his later years, he still enjoyed the club and gardening along with playing poker, trips to the casinos, Walnut Street theatre, and was an avid reader.

Stephen is predeceased by his father Stephen J Jr., his mother Katherine, his sister and brother-in-law Anna Marie and Nikolaus Wiener, brothers-in-law Harry Grod and John Nickle, and his son Stephen J the IV.

He is survived by his wife Mary, sister and brother-in-law Patricia and Nils Stolpe, sister Rose Marie, sister-in-law and brother-in-law Edna and Julius Wittenberg, sons and daughters-in-law; Leonard and Heather, Michael and Ellyn, Patrick and MaryEllen. His grandchildren; Ryan, Owen, Sam, Brendon, Lorelei, Danielle, Patrick, Tyler, and Earnest (Benjamin) along with several nieces and nephews.

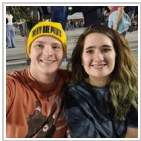
